Directors Meeting

Perth September 5<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1886

A meeting of the Directors of the Company was duly called and held at the office of the Secretary this evening. There were present -

James Thompson, Henry Moorhouse James Allan, Henry S. Leckie, and Edward G. McAlloch also John S. Hart Treasurer was present.

The President Henry D. Shaw Esq. being now deceased, it was moved and seconded that James Allan take the Chair.

The Chairman stated that it would be necessary to elect a president for the balance of this year.

It was moved by Henry Moorhouse and seconded by H. S. Leckie that James Thompson be President for the balance of this year - The motion was carried.

The President then took the chair.

Mr. McAlloch stated that an act had been passed by the Ontario Legislature empowering Cemetery Companies to enter into agreements binding the Company to preserve lots and maintain lot in the Cemetery and in other cemeteries in the same County in repair for all time to come in consideration of a gift a bequest.

He also produced a letter from Messrs Davidson & Syme Edinburgh Scotland, solicitors for the executors of the late Dr. James Wilson stating that Dr. Wilson had left one hundred pound sterling to be

invested upon Trust to provide a fund for keeping the burial place of Dr. Wilson wife and child in the old burying ground in Perth in repair and offering to hand over that money to the Perth Cemetery Company if the Company would enter into an agreement to maintain the above mentioned burial place in the old burying ground in repair for all time to come in pursuance of the act. The Solicitors also enclosed a draft agreement to be executed by the Company.

It was moved by Mr. Leckie seconded by Mr. Allan and resolved <sup>that</sup> this Company do agree to accept from the Executors of the late Dr. James Wilson the sum of One Hundred Pounds Sterling left by the will of the Testator as stated in the letter of Messrs Davidson & Syme with such interest as has accrued thereon to hold in trust in the terms of said letter and the President and Secretary are hereby duly authorized to duly execute the agreement so forwarded by said Davidson & Syme and to attach the corporate Seal thereto and the Secretary is authorized to forward the same to the solicitors and to request them on receipt to forward the amount mentioned in the agreement to Mr. McAlloch and the Secretary is authorized on receipt to pay the amount over to the Treasurer.

It was moved by Mr. Leckie seconded by Mr. Moorhouse and resolved

that the Secretary be authorized to have a copy of the agreement made and recorded in the minutes of the meetings of the Company - carried  
 Mr. Malloch stated that Charles Mair Executor of the will of the late Margaret McTyrone had left in his hands One Hundred dollars to be paid out to the Cemetery Company in Trust on their entering into an agreement similar to that to be entered into in respect of Dr. Wilson's Estate to maintain Mrs. McTyrone's place of burial in Elmvwood Cemetery in repair for all time to come.

It was moved by Mr. Moorhouse and seconded by Mr. Allan and resolved that this Company do accept the said sum of One Hundred dollars left by Charles Mair and do agree to maintain the said lot monument &c in repair as required and the President and Secretary are authorized to enter on behalf of the Company an agreement similar to that with Dr. Wilson's Executors for that purpose and to affix the Corporate seal to and sign the same and the Treasurer is authorized to receive payment of the said One Hundred Dollars on behalf of the company.

And the Secretary is required to enter a copy of the Agreement in the minutes of the proceedings of the meetings of the Company - and the Secretary is authorized to do all that is necessary to complete the Agreement this

in Dr. Wilson's Case - and the Treasurer is authorized to pay all such expenses as may be incurred therewith out of the funds of the Company - the motion was carried

It was moved by Mr. Moorhouse seconded by Mr. Allan and resolved that the Cemetery Company do give a free grant of a site in the Cemetery for the purpose of erecting thereon the Memorial monument to the memory of the late Lieutenant Kippen soon to be erected.

The following is a copy of the agreement entered into with the executors of the late Dr. James Wilson referred to in the above resolution.

We The Perth Cemetery Company of the Town of Perth in the County of Lanark Province of Ontario and Dominion of Canada considering that the late James Wilson sometime of the Town of Perth aforesaid, surgeon, afterwards residing at number forty four South Clerk Street Edinburgh Scotland and latterly at number six Dalrymple Crescent thereby his last Will and Testament dated the twenty ninth day of January Eighteen hundred and Eighty one registered in the Books of Council and Session on the twenty first day of July Eighteen hundred and Eighty one appointed Thomas Milligan his Brother in law of the farm of Barnmouth in the Parish of Dunsdeer in the County of Dumfries Scotland

Farmer and William Harrison his  
Nephew residing at Rutherglen in the  
County of Lanark Scotland to be his  
executors. That by the fifth purpose of the said  
Last Will and Testament the said  
James Wilson directed his said  
executors to take out of the sum which  
might be standing at the credit of his  
Current Account with the Bank of Scot-  
land Edinburgh Scotland the sum of One  
Hundred Pounds Sterling and to invest the  
same and to apply the interest thereon  
at the sight of the said Thomas Milligan  
so long as he was able to attend to the  
same in upholding and keeping in  
desert order the burying place of the Testator's  
wife and second monument thereon  
in the Old Burying Ground of the Town of  
Perth aforesaid and he directed his said  
Executors when the said Thomas Milligan  
should give the necessary instruc-  
tions to that effect to invest the said sum  
of One Hundred Pounds Sterling in the  
names of some Trustees (who might be  
a corporation or public Body in Scotland  
or in Canada approved of by the said Thomas  
Milligan) and such Trustees should  
hold the same and apply the interest  
after deducting all necessary expenses  
they might be put to for the above  
purpose; That the said James Wilson  
died on the Eleventh day of April  
Eighteen hundred and eighty one;  
That the said sum of One Hundred  
Pounds was on the Twenty-

of December eighteen hundred and eighty  
two lodged by the said Executors with  
the bank of Scotland on Deposit Recd  
That the said Thomas Milligan and  
the said executors have with the view  
of giving effect to the wishes of the Testator  
agreed to make over the said sum  
to us and we have agreed to accept  
the same in trust for the purpose  
above specified; And now seeing  
that the said Executors have uplifted  
the said sum of One Hundred Pounds  
contained in the said Deposit  
Receipt and have paid the same  
to us along with the sum of eight  
pounds three shillings and one  
penny being the interest accrued  
thereon but under deduction of  
the sum of four pounds four shil-  
lings being the expenses incurred in  
connection with these presents a-  
mounting the said two sums paid  
to us under the aforesaid deduc-  
tion to the sum of One Hundred and  
three pounds nineteen shillings  
and one penny sterling.

Therefore we do hereby acknowl-  
edge the receipt by us of the afore-  
said sum of One Hundred and  
three pounds nineteen shillings  
and one penny sterling and  
discharge the said Executors there-  
of and further we do hereby under-  
take and bind and oblige ourselves  
to hold the said sum so paid to

us in trust as aforesaid and from  
the free income thereof to uphold  
and keep in decent order in all  
time coming the burying place of  
the said Testator's wife and son and  
monument thereon in the Old  
Burying Ground of the Town of Perth

Perth June 14<sup>th</sup> 1889.

A meeting of The Directors of The Perth Cemetery Company was held at the office of the Treasurer on the evening of June 14<sup>th</sup> 1889. There were present the President Sheriff Thompson in the Chair and Messrs Leckie and James Allan.

The request of Caretaker Brown for a new summer kitchen to be added to his house was then taken into consideration. The cost was estimated to be about from \$75 to \$80, and on motion of Messrs Allan and Leckie the Treasurer was instructed to get an estimate from Mr. Rippon, and if he would undertake the work for above stated amount (\$75.00), to get him to do the work.

Sheriff Thompson also reported that Mr. Mallock the Secretary had requested him to have Dr. Wilson's lot in the old cemetery looked after and get the iron railing painted.

The Treasurer was therefore instructed to get this painting done, and also to provide a new pump for the cemetery and to get the front gate and fence painted.

Annual Meeting of Shareholders of the  
Perth Cemetery Company.

The meeting opened at 7-30 o'clock A.M.  
Sheriff Thompson the President  
took the chair and E. G. Malloch acted  
as Secretary.

The Secretary read the annual  
Report of the Directors for the past year  
which was as follows.

Report of the Directors of the Perth  
Cemetery Company to the share-  
holders, presented at the annual meet-  
ing called and held pursuant to notices  
in the Perth "Courier," "Expositor,"  
and "Star," newspapers published in  
Perth, in two issues of each, in the  
Council Chamber in the Town Hall in  
Perth on Monday, 20th January, 1890,  
pursuant to the statute in that behalf.

The Directors beg leave to report  
that by the report of the Treasurer  
herewith presented, it will be seen that  
the finances of the Company are in a  
flourishing condition. The debt of the  
Company incurred for the purchase  
and embellishment of the cemetery,  
and for the payment of which your  
Directors were personally liable for  
many years, has all been paid off, and  
after providing for the caretaker's salary  
and all other expenditure there  
remains a balance on hand from the  
ordinary receipts of the Company of  
\$1,286.94.

Your Directors procured an amend-  
ment to the Ontario Cemetery Com-  
pany's Act to be passed, empowering  
such companies to accept payment from  
Executors and Trustees, of moneys  
given them by Testators and others for  
the purpose of maintaining burying  
places in repair for all time to come  
and to enter into agreements to that  
end.

Under these powers your Directors  
received from the Executors of the late  
Dr. James Wilson, and Mrs. Margaret  
McIntyre, the sums of £103 19s 1d,  
Sterling, and \$100 respectively and have  
in consideration thereof entered into  
agreements on behalf of Your Company  
to maintain in repair for all time to  
come the burying place of the wife and  
child of Dr. Wilson in the old burying  
ground in Perth, and of Mrs. McIntyre  
and her father and mother, in Elmwood  
cemetery.

These two sums, which with accrued  
interest amount to \$665, are in the  
hands of the Treasurer on deposit re-  
ceipt and are available for the general  
purposes of the Company.

The Company have now on hand a  
total balance of \$1,951.94 all available  
for any purposes for which the Com-  
pany may see fit to apply it in connec-  
tion with the cemetery.

The Directors desire to draw the  
attention of the shareholders to the fact  
that the receipts from burials do not  
pay more than one-half of the care-  
taker's salary, the balance being made  
up from the proceeds of the sale of lots  
in the cemetery.

Your Directors have used their best  
endeavors to conduct the affairs of the  
Company with economy. The care-  
taker is the only person connected with  
the Company who has received any re-  
muneration for his services. The ser-  
vices of your Directors and of all the  
other officers of the Company have  
been rendered gratuitously. Notwith-  
standing the economy with which the  
cemetery has been managed and the  
handsome surplus now in the hands of  
your Treasurer, the Directors are able  
to congratulate the shareholders on the  
attractive and creditable appearance  
which Elmwood cemetery presents and  
they believe it will compare favorably  
with the cemetery of any other town of  
the size of Perth, either in Canada or  
in Britain.

The Directors respectfully ask each  
shareholder individually to inform  
himself of the nature of the amendment  
to the law referred to in this report  
and to take every advantage offered to  
induce testators and others having lots  
in the cemetery or other burial places  
in the County to set apart a sum of  
money to be given to this Company in  
trust for the purpose of maintaining  
such burying places in repair for all  
time to come.

Your Treasurer in presenting his statement and report for the year ending December 31, 1889, congratulates the proprietors and board of managers on the exceptionally good financial position of your company.

That during the past year the revenue from the sales of lots has been much below the average, yet the revenue from other sources has been about the same as in other years, and therefore enabled you managers to keep up the average expenditure on the grounds, and to add \$85 to the permanent improvement of the caretaker's dwelling, by the addition of a new kitchen, and still to keep the expenses of the year within the income.

The large sum of about \$8,500 has been expended by your company since its formation in 1872, under the following heads: for the property say \$2,500, and interest on same say \$500, or a total on property account of \$3,000, and a further sum of \$5,500 on the grounds for permanent improvements, decorations, caretaker's salary, and other current expenses, making an annual average expenditure of about \$825 for the past 17 years.

This large expenditure has not been without adequate results. Your Treasurer and managers take credit to themselves for their very careful execution management, and say that it is to their most careful attention to your interests that the fine and creditable appearance of your cemetery is due.

The revenues for the year 1885, 6 and 7 were larger than the average of former years, and enabled your Treasurer to carry forward larger balances, until now the respectable sum of \$1,051.94 stands to your credit at the beginning of this year.

This sum I may say is made up by the sum of \$1,286 from the ordinary revenue of the company, and a further sum of \$603 of trust monies, which has been specially referred to in your directors report, and an additional sum of \$62 of accumulated interest on same, making a grand total of \$1,951.

This large balance I assure you has been the slow and careful accumulation of past balances, and by the careful expenditure of your directors it has attained to the respectable sum now presented.

I may also say that your treasurer and directors have for several years past been desirous of undertaking a large expenditure on new fences, which have now become necessary from the recent storms, and congratulate your new directors on having the funds available for so desirable an undertaking.

Your treasurer in closing his report desires to direct your careful attention and examination of the statement here-with submitted, and from which you will see that not a dollar has been expended on the management of the company since its formation; that in no case has any director or officer of the company been paid for service, that the revenue has all been expended strictly on the items of improvement, current expenses and caretaker's salary.

After the close of the meeting of the shareholders a meeting of the new Directors of the Company was held when James Bell was elected President, E.G. Malloch, Secretary and John Hart, Treasurer for the ensuing year and the President, Secretary and Treasurer were appointed a Managing Committee for the same period.

It was moved by Sheriff Thompson seconded by Mr. Moorhouse, and resolved that the Managing Committee be instructed to get a number of seats, for the Cemetery, not exceeding six -

It was moved by Mr. Allan, seconded by Mr. Thompson, and resolved that the Managing Committee be instructed to procure such assistance for the caretaker as they may deem necessary

It was moved by Mr. Moorhouse, seconded by Sheriff Thompson, and resolved, that the managing Committee be instructed to deal with the Council as to the plants in the sidewalk on Drummond Street and to have a sidewalk laid, from Drummond Street to the Cemetery Gate -

It was moved by Mr. Allan, seconded by Mr. Moorhouse and resolved, that the managing Committee be instructed to have any necessary painting and repairs done on the gates and gate posts.

Mr. Hart reported that the managing Committee had procured a cart at £15<sup>00</sup>.

He also stated that the Committee had got a Lawnmower for £8<sup>00</sup>. They had also got the use of a Sprinkler, gratis, which they thought the Company would have the use of for a considerable time; and they had purchased 50 feet of hose and a brass nozzle.

Mr. Hart also presented a draft of a seal for the Cemetery prepared by Mr. Pink -

It was moved by Mr. Allan, seconded by Mr. Thompson and resolved, that the Managing Committee be instructed to have a fence erected at each side of the Cemetery proper, to be made of spars, according to the plan, now presented by the Committee, at this meeting, and that they

ask for tenders for the work before contracting for it.

It was moved by Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. Leckie and resolved, that Mr. Mallock, Matheson & Hall, be a Committee to consider and prepare a form of agreement for keeping burial places in repair, and to arrange with the executors of the late Thomas Mansfield, as to the terms of their proposed grant, and report at a future meeting.

It was moved by Mr. Bell, seconded by Mr. Leckie and resolved, that the Treasurer be instructed to pay the accounts of A.J. Matheson £1 £11<sup>00</sup> and Edward James for £6.20, presented at this meeting

Annual Meeting of the Shareholders of

The meeting opened at 7.30 o'clock P.M.  
James Bell the ~~President~~ took the chair and E. G. Malloch acted as Secretary.

The Secretary read the minutes of the last annual meeting which were sustained. The Secretary then read the report of the Directors for the past year. In connection with this was also read the report of the Treasurer to the Directors containing a statement of the receipts and disbursements for the past year. and on motion these reports were adopted.

The following is the Directors Report:-

Report of the Directors of the Perth Cemetery Company to the shareholders, presented at the annual meeting called, and held pursuant to notices in the Perth Courier, Expositor, and STAR newspapers published in Perth, in two issues of each, in the Council Chamber in the Town Hall in Perth, on Saturday 24th Jan., 1891, pursuant to the statute in that behalf.

The Directors beg leave to report that during the past year, extensive improvements have been made in the Cemetery grounds and on fencing, and upon the sidewalk and road approaching the Cemetery.

Tenders were called for and received for the erection of a permanent spar fence on either side of the Cemetery, extending back about 1,200 feet from the road in front. The contract was awarded to Wm. Allan at a reasonable price, and was erected by him under the supervision of a competent overseer, who reported to your directors that the work had been done, both as to material and workmanship in a most satisfactory manner. This fence is one of the greatest improvements that have been made in the Cemetery since it was opened. The total cost was \$376.38.

A new fence of about 100 feet in length was also built in front of the property adjoining the undertaker's house with gates, adding much to the appearance of the property.

The gates in front of the Cemetery have been repainted, and 26 hitching posts were erected in front of the Cemetery, as a protection to the fence and for the convenience of the public attending funerals.

Six additional seats were also provided for the convenience and comfort of visitors at a moderate cost.

For some years past it has been considered very desirable to have the road graded from the head of Drummond St. to the entrance of the Cemetery, improved by the grading of the roadway and the building of a sidewalk. This much needed improvement your directors have completed this year at a comparatively small cost—about \$60—and now there is a continuous sidewalk averaging five feet in width from the town to the cemetery.

A lawn mower, hose and hose-reel for watering purposes, and a cart and cart harness for use in the grounds have been added to the stock of tools of the company.

As in former years considerable additions were made in trees planted in the grounds.

The foregoing improvements have greatly enhanced the value and added to the appearance of the Cemetery.

The report of the Treasurer herewith presented shows that the finances of the Company are still in a most satisfactory condition. The Treasurer's accounts for the past year have been audited by Mr. Robert Jamieson, whose report shows that the balance still on hand after paying for all the above mentioned improvements is \$1,642.70. This balance is only about \$300.00 less than that shown by the annual statement of last year.

# The following is the Treasurer's Report

TREASURER'S REPORT.  
To the President and Directors of The Perth Cemetery Company:

In presenting my annual statement for the year ending Dec. 31st 1890, and in comparing it with previous statement you will be pleased to find that the average annual income has been fully maintained for the past year.

The amount received from the sale of Lots to Lot-holders has been larger than in 1889; but not so large as in previous years; whilst the amount received from the services of this caretaker for Burials, remains at the same average annual sum that has been received for several years past, showing that the receipts from this latter source might be almost looked upon as a fixed amount in your annual income.

These are the only two sources of income at the command of the Company, and in directing the Company's affairs and your expenditure in the future it will be of the utmost importance to give these items your careful consideration.

The liberal expenditures which you have undertaken during the past year under the general direction of the proprietors has materially reduced your balance as shown at the close of last year. This balance was then \$1351.44, and is yet the very respectable sum of \$1642.70, being over \$300 less than it was a year ago.

The expenditure for the past year although much larger than for several years past, has been timely, and on much needed repairs, and I have no doubt the proprietors will appreciate and offer their congratulations for the care and economy you have exercised in looking after their interests.

You will also be able to report to their satisfaction on the very valuable and permanent

character of these improvements made on their property, and as showing full value for all your expenditure.

In submitting this report and statement I have again to congratulate you upon maintaining so large and respectable a balance at your credit as shown above, and verified by your auditor's certificate attached thereto.

Mr. Hart read report of the Executive Committee on improvements at the Cemetery which was as follows.—

To the President,

And Directors of the Beth Cemetery Company.

To your Committee of Management beg to submit the following Report for your consideration.

That at the last meeting of your Board we were instructed to have certain repairs made on the care

takers house and a new tool house erected, a new squared fence on the south side of the travelled roadway from the Care taker's house - North to the boundary line between Glennis and your property, and a new well made in the Cemetery, at or near the stone pillars.

That we consulted Mr. Duncan Kippin as to the extent of repairs the House would require to put it into good condition and prevailed upon him an estimate of the cost of these repairs, the new tool house and the fence. In examining the House it was found that it would be difficult to estimate the cost of several items, and to take tenders for this work a larger sum would have to be charged to cover the probable cost. We therefore decided to employ Mr. Kippin agreeing to charge the materials and labor at Cost. for the repairs on the house and tool-house. For the new fence we asked for Tenders and accepted Mr. Kippins at 15¢ per running foot the lowest offer you Committee received.

The work has been done in a very satisfactory manner. The house had new chimney tops - the stone foundation made good all around the main building - the walls covered with felt, paper, clapboards, New Windows in the front, and side and a new verandah - a storm and ironies - door in the kitchen and the whole painted with two coats of paint. The house and kitchen is " as the outside - in thorough repair.

substantial frame building 16x20 ft.  
13 ft Posts, clapboarded and painted  
to match the House - giving ample  
accommodation for the storage of boat  
Tools and other property of the Company.

The new fence on the south side  
of the roadway from the House to  
the northern boundary is a good and  
substantial job - good material and

The water closets erected as previously  
reported have been painted with two

The Directors beg leave to report that we have again to draw your attention to the very extensive and necessary improvements that have been made on your Cemetery Property during the past year.

The Caretaker's dwelling house has been for some years past in a very dilapidated condition and it became necessary to make certain repairs on the house in the interest of the property and for the comfort of the caretaker.

We found also that it had become a necessity to provide a building for the storing of the various tools belonging to the Company.

Your Directors therefore after due consideration consulted with Mr. Kippin as to the proper repairs to make on the dwelling house &c and procured from him an estimate of the cost of these repairs, and of a new building as a tool house and a new fence along the roadway north of the Caretaker's dwellinghouse. These and other improvements have been made of a substantial and permanent character which greatly adds to the value of your property and all within the estimated cost.

The house has been very much improved it was covered with tared paper, newly clap-boarded a new verandah added, the old window sash replaced by new sash, and all neatly painted with a suitable color.

A new building 16 x 20 feet, and one story high, for the propery storing of the Company's tools was erected. It was also clap-boarded and painted to match the house in style and color.

A new sparred fence of about 450 feet in length was erected along the line of the travelled road from the Caretaker's house to the boundary line between Gleis and your property and with the exception of the stable or barn in the rear of the dwelling-house your property now is in first class condition. The house has been made habitable and with the new tool house, presents a neat and comfortable appearance and with the new fence which was also painted in front of the buildings your whole property has been greatly and ~~handsomely~~ improved and presents an appearance in keeping with the Cemetery grounds. In the Cemetery, trees and shrubs have as usual been planted and the grounds kept in their usual good condition. A new well or reservoir for water has been excavated in the hollow ground near the stonepile. This unsightly pile of stones has been used around the reservoir converting what was a large space of waste ground into what will soon become a place of beauty. Your Directors intend making a flower plot measured around the reservoir and to lay out burial plots in part of the ground, the sale of which will more than recoup your expenditure on this part of the Cemetery. The Treasurer's report is herewith presented and we are pleased to report a very respectable balance carried forward to the new account after the payment of all expenses incurred from the improvements as noted in the foregoing report.
